

## **Dorval Municipal Tennis Club House Rules**

The Dorval Municipal Tennis Club (or DMTC) is one of the most beautiful tennis clubs on the Island of Montreal. Located on the premium grounds of the City of Dorval's Sarto-Desnoyers Community Centre, here you can enjoy a great tennis match or relax on one of the greenest terraces in town.

Every year, over 400 tennis players of all ages and categories call DMTC their tennis home from May to October. The club provides eight Har-Tru tennis courts – always kept in mint condition.

The club's atmosphere is friendly and inviting. In order to allow for smooth operation as well as to ensure an enjoyable season for all members and visitors, the Club asks that a few simple house rules be respected. These are listed below.

### **Membership Tags**

- Once you are properly registered as a Club member, a Club magnetic tag with your name will be made available. This tag will be kept on the Club House Members' Board and will be used as your ID or membership card for booking courts.

### **Club Monitors**

- Club Monitors will be on duty during Club Operating Hours to help you with court bookings and guide you in all planned club activities.

### **Court Booking**

- Upon arrival, ask the Club Monitor to locate your membership tag.
- Have him place the tag on the court booking board for the court and timeslot available.
- Singles courts are booked for 45 minute periods. Doubles courts are booked for one hour periods. All bookings must be made in person with the Club Monitor on duty on a first come, first served basis.
- Bookings can be made at any time before the desired court time.
- Two players must be present at the Club when booking for singles.
- For doubles games, three players must be present at the Club to book. The fourth player is required to be present no later than five minutes before court time.
- Double booking (the booking of one court while you are still booked for another period) is not allowed. Double booking will not be tolerated and repeat offenders may have their playing privileges revoked.

## **Attire and Footwear**

- **Tennis attire.** Proper tennis attire is always recommended and expected. White tennis clothes are not obligatory.
- **Footwear:** All players must always wear proper tennis shoes while on court. Only flat-soled tennis shoes are allowed as these do not have excessive tread and will not damage the Har-Tru clay courts. Running shoes and cross-trainers are not acceptable footwear.
